- 1. 47.5 % Student have rated B.Ed course as *Very good*, 20% rated *Moderately Good*, 17.5% rated as *good*, 13.75 % rated as *Extremely Good* only 1.25 % student have rated it as *Poor* course. Overall students were satisfied with B.Ed course.
- 2. 36.25% student feel that syllabus was challenging,, 56.25% think that syllabus of this course was *Adequate* 3.75% feel that it was *inadequate* and 3.75% student said that this course was dull. Most of students were happy with syllabus of the course.
- 3. 47.5% students said that their background was *highly relevant* for this course, 31.5 % said it was *Partly Relevant*, 15 % students said that it was *Relevant* to their background 2.5% student said that it was *Dull* and 3.75 % student said that it was *Mostly irrelevant*. Only 6% student said that their background was not benefiting for this course.
- 4. 52.5% student said that 90 to 100% syllabus was completed, while 37.5% students said that 75 to 90% syllabus was completed in the class. 8.75% student said 50 to 75% syllabus was completed. Only one student said that 40 to 50% syllabus was completed. There is need to monitor closely how much syllabus being completed by the staff.
- 5. 67.5% students said that library holdings for this course were *Excellent*, while 23.5% said it was *Adequate* and 8.75% said it was *Inadequate*. Over all most of student were happy and satisfied with library holdings.
- 6. 46.5 % students said that they could get prescribed learning material easily, they rate as Excellent, while 45.0% rated it as *Adequate* and 8.75% said it was *Inadequate* and 1.25% said it was poor. Over all most of students was satisfied availability of prescribed readings.
- 7. Internal evaluation is important part of the course 41.25% student said that internal evaluation system was *Excellent*, 45% said it was *Adequate* 10% said it was *inadequate* and 3.75% said it was *Poor*.
- 8. 26.25% students said that weightage of internal assessment should be given 100%, while 46.25% student said it should be 75%, 17.5% said it should be 50%, 7.5% said it should be 25% and only 2.5% said it should be less than 25%. Overall most of student wants to increase the weightage of internal assessment.
- 9. Internal assessment system is integral part of present evaluation system.

- 1. 25% students said that this system was highly helpful to understand early discovery of difficulties, while 47% students said it was appreciably useful, 5% said students said that it was moderately conducive, only 3% student thought that this system was poorly helpful to find out early discovery of difficulties.
- II. 33% students found present internal system highly useful in regular work, while 30% said it was appreciably useful 16% said that it was moderately usefully and only 1.25% student said that this system was poorly conducive in regular work.
- III. 36% students said that internal system was highly useful in interaction with teacher, 40% said that it was appreciably useful in interaction with teacher and 4 % students said that it was moderately conducive in interaction with teacher.
- IV. 33% students said that this system was highly helpful to in *continuous self assessment*, while 33% students said it was appreciably useful, 13 % said students said that it was moderately conducive, only 1.25% student thought that this system was poorly helpful in *continuous self assessment*,.
- 10. Student can't understand this question and most of them not given response to this question.
- 11. 75% students rated this college as superior in comparison to other teacher training college and 25% student think that this college is equal as other.
- 12. Overall student teacher relation is very important. 41.25% students thought that their relationship with all teachers was very good, 40% said it was good 15% said, it was satisfactory 2.5 % said it was unsatisfactory and 1.25% said it was very poor.
- 13. Student's relation with their method teacher is also important. 62.5% students thought that their relationship with their method teacher was Very good, 37.5% said it was good 6.25% students said it was satisfactory..
- 14. Administrative office must be helpful and respond quickly. 40% students found office was very helpful, 43.75 % students said office was helpful and 3.75% students said it was indifferent. 6.25 % said it was unsatisfactory and 6.25% said it was very poor.
- 15. 51.25% students said that hostel facilities was very good, 35% said that it was good and 13.75% student said hostel facilities was satisfactory.
- 16. 45% students said that travelling facilities was very good, 45% said that it was good and 8.75% student said travelling facilities was satisfactory and 1.25% said it was very poor.
- 17. 36.25% student said that they have participated very often in extracurricular activities, while 28.75% student said often, 27.6% said sometime and 2.5% said rarely participated and 5% said they never participated in extracurricular activities.
- 18. 72.5% student said that attitude of teacher towards extracurricular activities was co-operative, 22.5% said it was indifferent and 5% said it was discouraging.

- 19. 78.5% students said that time at the college was useful for intellectually enriching, 16.5 said it was marginally useful and 5% students said that was not useful.
- 20. After leaving this college 77.5% student said that they will talk proudly, 22.5% indifferently talk about this college.
- 21. Overall rating given by students to B.Ed program was as follows.
- Academic content of this program- 52.5% student said it was very good, 46.25said it was good and
   1.25 said it was average.
- II. Fairness of evaluation of this program- 37.5% students said it was very good, 57.5% student said it was good and 5% said it was average.
- III. *Interaction with faculty-* 42.5% students said it was very good, 55% students said it was good, 1.25% students said it was average, 1.25% said it was poor.
- IV. *Interaction with administration* 30% students said it was very good, 67.5% students said it was good, 2.5% students said it was average, 1.25% said it was poor and 1.25% said it was very poor.
- V. Library Facilities- 61.25% students was happy with library facilities they rated it as very good, 38.75 % students rated it as good.
- VI. Computer Facilities- 37.5% students was happy with computer facilities, they have rated it as very good, 62.5 %students rated it as good.
- VII. Hostel Facilities- 23.75% students was happy with hostel facilities they rated it as very good, 75 %students rated it as good and 1.25% said it was average.
- VIII.Recreational facilities- 43.75% students said these facilities were very good, 74.5% said it was good and 7.5% said it was average.
- IX. Extra-curricular activities- 32.40 % students said these activities were very good, 58.75% students said it was good and 2.5% said it was average.
- X. 57.5% students was happy with sports facilities 38.75% students said it was good and 3.75% said it was average.
